

Findings of CQC visit to Fitzwarren House on 15 January 2014

What have CQC told us?	What will we do?
Care records examined were found not to be well organised or up to date in terms of risk assessment and the reviewing of plans. Information was not easy to access.	Review and update care records to include risk assessments and supporting documents such as food and fluid charts where appropriate.
The provider had failed to ensure there were suitable arrangements in place for recording accurate records of the care, treatment and support provided to each service user.	Send invitations to relatives to participate in care reviews should they wish and if appropriate.
Review of the files indicated that not everyone has been through a capacity assessment to ensure that their rights were protected.	Mental Capacity Act training has been delivered to staff. This has increased awareness within the home in relation to capacity and capacity assessments. We have introduced updated Mental Capacity assessments and Best Interests decision tools. These are being implemented within the home where service users needs indicate they are required.
