Any time of year is a great time to get arty outdoors.

Spring – Make a nest

Use bendy sticks or ivy to make a roughly circular base on a paper plate.
Weave smaller twigs, grasses and reeds between the sticks. Keep adding until you can't see the plate anymore!
You can use mud like glue and leave it to dry.
Line your nest with moss, lichen and feathers.
Hide it in a hedge - or fill with chocolate eggs

Summer Butterfly on your wrist

Cut wings from coloured paper or baking paper (which flutters nicely).
Decorate butterfly wings with pens, sequins, tiny leaves, petals.
Glue centre of wings to a wrist band made of thin card.
Glue a small stick across the centre of the wings for the body.
Fly together around the garden.



Autumn Carpet

Collect coloured leaves, conkers and seeds. Clear a small area of woodland floor and design a beautiful carpet of colours.

Winter Crown

Cut some long lengths of ivy from a tree trunk. Twist and weave them into a circle to fit your head. Decorate with other leaves, fir cones, seedheads and berries.
Be the King or Queen of the Winter woodland.
