



Since the confirmation that there has been a case of confirmed Covid-19 at MHA Ty Gwyn care home in Penarth, sadly we have lost some of our loved residents. Our thoughts are with all the families at this difficult time.

We are unable to confirm if these are related to Covid-19 as testing for the virus has not been carried out.

Our team at MHA Ty Gwyn is doing a fantastic job in caring for our residents and we would like to ask the local community to show their support for them at this time of national crisis.

It has been claimed locally that the home does not have enough PPE for the team at MHA Ty Gwyn. This is not the case. MHA is working with its suppliers to make sure all of its homes and retirement living communities are kept stocked.

MHA is in regular contact with Government and public health bodies to press for the testing for coronavirus in those working in care and nursing homes and the people they care for, as well as those who sadly die to determine if it is for the virus or other reasons.

The home is currently restricted to visitors to minimise the impact on our residents and those caring for them. Wherever possible, visits by health personnel will be maintained.
