

Visiting space	Risk of Covid-19 transmission	Risk controls
Outdoor visit	Low	<p>Demonstration of same day LFD negative self-test, social distancing, hand hygiene; mask if within two metres, entering garden spaces without using the main building, declaration that symptom free.</p> <p>Weather permitting, this is the safest option for all.</p>
Dedicated visiting pod with full screen	Low	<p>Demonstration of same day LFD negative self-test, declaration that symptom free, fresh air ventilation, hand hygiene, PPE, cleaning of touch points post use.</p> <p>This is also a safe option as the pod has a physical unbroken screen between resident and their visitor.</p>
Internal visiting room with substantial screen	Medium	<p>LFD same day testing (competency assessed self-test or completed by dedicated testing facility), fresh air ventilation, two metre distancing, PPE, hand hygiene, number limiting and cleaning of touch points post use.</p> <p>Safe option where fresh air ventilation is easy.</p>
Limited contact visiting (indoors)	High	<p>LFD tests carried out at the home, visiting in dedicated space or resident's room, fresh air ventilation, brief hand holding otherwise two metre distancing, PPE, two visitors per person at any one time.</p> <p>Essential family carer / essential care giver can be present along with these two visitors.</p>
Residents room	High	<p>Part of the testing programme that staff access (treated as member of staff team), PCR and LFD tests carried out at the home, declaration that symptom free on entry, residents are 22 days post their second vaccination (unless receiving end of life care); PPE.</p> <p>Limited to essential family carer and essential care givers</p>
Visit out of the home	High	<p>LFD testing (competency assessed self-test or completed by dedicated testing facility) for immediate family accompanying resident, encourage social distancing, mask wearing indoors and well ventilated indoor spaces.</p>
